### KEY DEVELOPMENTS

- ADNOC has delivered the world's first certified bulk commercial shipment of low-carbon ammonia enabled by CCS to Mitsui & Co. for use in clean-power generation in Japan. The low-carbon certification process, from production to delivery, has been conducted by certification agency TÜV SÜD.
- ACWA Power has signed a MoU with China's SINOPEC Guangzhou Engineering Co., Ltd. about a potential collaboration in the production of green hydrogen and ammonia.
- Japanese utility Electric Power Development signed a joint study agreement with two Australian carbon capture and storage developers, deepC Store and Azuli, for a strategic partnership.
- The two Australian companies have been awarded two greenhouse gas assessment permits, or GHG acreages, in the Bonaparte and Browse Basins, some 200-250 km off Australia's Northwest coast.
- Japan's Nippon Steel and Sumitomo Corp have confirmed that they have won orders from QatarEnergy for high-alloy seamless pipes that will be used for CCS. Nippon Steel recently shipped the first products to QatarEnergy which plans to build a blue ammonia manufacturing plant with CCS, in the Mesaieed region.



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
